I call on you to ensure that Bayram Mammadov and Giyas Ibrahimov are immediately and unconditionally released and that the drug charges against them are dropped.

Bayram and Giyas were tortured into confessing to possession of heroin, which was planted on them – a ruse used by police whose real motives were to punish the students for spraying graffiti on the statue of the former president of Azerbaijan, Heydar Aliyev.

They were both sentenced to 10 years in prison for exercising their right to freedom of expression. Please release them now.

Dear Director,

Human rights activist Su Changlan has been detained since October 2014 in very bad conditions and she has not been granted regular access to her family and lawyer. Simultaneously, she has been provided with insufficient medical care, which has led to worsening of her condition.

We are urging you to immediately and unconditionally release Su Changlan, as she is a prisoner of conscience, held solely for exercising her right to freedom of expression. At the same time, we are urging you to ensure that, pending her release, she is granted immediate access to specialized medical care, her family and a lawyer and that she is not subjected to torture or any other bad treatments.

We are calling you to ensure that her family and friends will not be detained, bullied or subjected to any limitations of their freedom of expression or association in case of effort to support her.

I call on you to ensure immediate and unconditional release of Arash Sadeghi from Evin Prison. I appeal to you to grant him until his release urgent medical care, which was denied as an additional

punishment. I also request to initiate investigation, who is responsible for denial of medical care to Arash, which could amount to torture given his medical needs, and bring him/them to justice in proceedings that meet international fair trial standards.

Arash Sadeghi was sentenced to 15 years in jail for gathering and colluding crimes against national security. In fact the court verdict cited only peaceful human rights activities, for example participation in peaceful gatherings protesting the detention and execution of political prisoners or denouncing of physical assaults of prisoners during raid in Evin prison. In my opinion Arash shouldn't be imprisoned for exercising their right to freedom of expression and gathering.
